****Novice entrants may not cross-enter in the Open Division.**

Families may enter for the \$45.00 entry fee plus:

- \$40.00 for each additional family member under the age of 18 showing in the Open Division or,
- \$25 for each additional family member under the age of 18 showing in the Novice Division

Proxy Showing

Proxy showing is available for a \$5.00 registration fee and a \$2.00 per horse charge up to 17 horses. More than 17 horses (to a maximum of 50) may be shown for a \$40.00 entry fee.

Please make checks payable to Region 10 Regionals.

- Open Division entry fee includes all Open Divisions only and entry for **50** horses.
- Novice Division entry fee includes the Novice Division only and entry for **30** horses. Novice entrants cannot cross-enter in the Open Division.
- Breakfast and lunch will be available to purchase on premises if desired, or there are fast food restaurants nearby.
- At least ½ of a standard table and chair is included. Please bring your own tablecloth.

Why hold a benefit show?

A portion of the funds raised will go to Region 10 Regionals (RXR). This benefit show is being held due to the rising costs of holding a year-end show like RXR, where there are special awards, out of Region judges and a catered lunch is included in the entry fee. It is necessary to raise funds for this show in advance to make the annual RXR feasible for everyone to enter and to be able to continue the show into the future. This funding allows us to offer incentive packages for Out of Region judges to come and judge at our show, and see what Region 10 has to offer.

A portion of the funds raised will go to The Albany Therapeutic Riding Center. It is an all volunteer organization that provides low cost therapeutic riding services to the community. They provide trained staff and horses for this purpose at their facility at 182 Martin Road, Voorheesville NY 12186. The funds raised will go for the care and maintenance of their horses. The Breyer/Reeves Co. has recognized and honored them in the past with an award for their fine work in the community.

Awards:

- Dutch Treat Live has been approved for NAMSHA membership for the open classes. Entries that place either first or second in any of the Open Divisions will earn qualifications to NAN 2009/2010. For additional information about this program, please refer to www.namsha.org
- Custom designed paper ribbons for 1st- 6th,
- Custom commercial rosettes for all sectional champions.
- Entries that place either first or second at this show will be eligible to compete at the next Region 10 Regional Show (November 2009). Visit www.regionXnation.com for further information about this program.
- This show is a participant in the NY Thruway Live Show Series. We will be keeping track of cumulative points. At the end of the season, during Region 10 Regionals, we will award High Point Awards for horses/owners who competed at these shows. The 2009 show series will include: Buffalo Spring Thaw, Queen City Classic, Hudson Valley Live, Dutch Treat Live, Lilac City Live, and Hudson Valley Fall Classic.

NOVICES

Classes in the Novice division are **not** NAN qualifiers. For this show, a novice is defined as someone who has been live model showing for less than two years and has not won a champion or reserve at an open show. Youth showers age 16 and under are welcome to show in the Novice division regardless of number of years they have been showing. Novice halter classes are judged on breed standards only and are open to OF plastic models only. Test runs, raffle models, OOAK's, connoisseur series, and other rare models cannot be shown in the Novice breed classes. These horses must be shown in the Novice collectability class only and are not

eligible for overall championships. CM by novice entries are not eligible for overall championships. Also, the novice collectability class is not eligible for Thruway Series high points.

****The Region 10 Novice Performance Program****

This show is a participant in the Region 10 Novice Performance Program. Region 10 actively supports training our Novice Class to show Performance entries. This is an opportunity for hands on experience. A variety of tack, props, and models will be available for novice entrants to borrow to use in novice performance classes. There will be a “designated helper” on hand to assist with any questions about tack fit and appropriate set-up.

Model Finish Definitions

Original Finish – is defined as any model that is mass-produced at a factory (i.e. Breyer, Stone, Hartland) and has not been altered in any way after leaving the factory. This includes, but is not limited to, the use of spray polish, applying polish to hooves, or adding a glossy finish to a matte model. Touch-ups are permitted if not obvious.

Custom Models – are defined as any model that has been changed from its original form in any media. These classes also include models made by hand and cold-painted china.

Artist Resins – are defined as any model, regardless of number in run, which has been home or professionally cast. Original Sculptures also qualify for the resin division. Resins that have been altered after casting still enter the resin classes.

OF China – any factory produced china, porcelain, cold-cast porcelain, or resin models show in the china division. This includes Hagen –Renaker, Japan chinas, OF Breyer porcelains, North Lights, BHR resins, Border Fine Arts, the Starlite Collection, and H&H Winner’s Circle OF Resin Line.

CM Glazed China - any china horse that has been altered from its original finish by firing a permanent glaze onto the horse, or uniquely glazed by the factory, sculptor or another artist in a color not released in a regular edition. Cold-painted china or mass-produced resin horses belong in the Custom division.

Halter Class Guidelines

Entrants may show up to three horses per halter class. Additional horses may be entered for \$1.00 per horse. Place the horse and the dollar on the table. The show hostess will collect the dollars. Proceeds will be donated to RXR. Halter classes will be double-judged for breed standards and either collectability or workmanship. This means that for halter classes, horses can potentially win two ribbons in the same class – one for breed and one for collectability or workmanship.

1. Halters/bridles/other tack are optional for breed classes. If you do use a halter (etc.), it should fit correctly and be the correct type for the breed/age/sex.
2. Each horse may enter only one breed class.
3. Short descriptive paragraphs and reference photos are encouraged for rare breeds and /or rare colors. Documentation size is not to exceed 8 ½ x 11 inches. Please do not place books on the table.
4. Documentation for collectability and COA’s are encouraged and strongly recommended for
*Breyers/Other Manufacturers and OF chinas.
*Good references for Breyer models are “Ponylagoon” at ponylagoon.muerte.net and “Identify Your Breyers” at www.identifyyourbreyer.com.

- Documentation is ****required**** for Peter Stone horses being judged for collectability. Any Stone horse considered for collectability **must** provide documentation (index card up to 8 ½ X 11 sheet) stating information about the model* (Date manufactured, number in run, SR/RR, origin, etc.). There are just too many Stones out there for comparison for the judges to keep them all in their heads.

PERFORMANCE CLASS GUIDELINES

Entrants may show up to two entries per performance class. For any set-up with more than one horse – **tag Only ONE horse**. The horse will be the only one listed in the results and will be the horse to earn the NAN qualification. The remaining horses are considered props. Documentation for unusual Performance classes is strongly encouraged.

- All classes (except pleasure classes) **MUST** have a card explaining what the model is doing. If there is no card with the entry, it will not be judged.
- Classes will be judged based on the model appearing to be correctly performing the task as stated in the description, the suitability and fit of tack for the task, and performing the task in a safe manner.
- Riders/handlers are optional. However, if you use the rider/handler/driver and it is incorrectly positioned, it may detract from the entry and lower its placing.
- Do not use any solid backgrounds. The horse must be visible from all sides.
- Calf/animal is required for any stock work.
- Cart and driver are optional for harness.
- State level and movement for dressage.
- State type of outfit for costume. Documentation is strongly encouraged.

Identity TAGS

Dutch Treat Live will be using the **Region 10 Tag Manager System** to track the entrants and horses and to generate results. For this show, Entrants and their horses must be registered in the Tag Manager system. If you do not already have a Region 10 shower number, you must contact the “keeper of the numbers”, Jackie Arns at drsteggy@drsteggy.com. In your email put your name and email address and request a Region 10 Exhibitor Number. This will be your permanent Region 10 Shower ID number that you can use at any Region 10 show. Horses **MUST** be entered into the system prior to the start of the show.

Each shower is responsible for creating their own tags. Avery tags #11062 or equivalent (1 ¾” to 1 3/32” in size) white and stringed should be used. These can be found at any office supply store, Target, Walmart, and the like. You may also want to purchase labels to print and stick or glue sticks to cut and paste.

OK, now you have your Shower Number ID and the blank tags. Next step, please visit <http://tags.annsmodels.com/> to enter your horse list. You assign a 3 digit number to each model. Example: You are # 888. Your first horse could be Big Red number 001. His show number would be 888-001, a unique identification number, a combination of your ID number and his number. Do the same, assign a 3 digit number, to register each horse that you want to bring to the show.

Now to create ID labels for the tags. You can use the tag system to print labels for your tags as well. Follow the directions on the web site. You can use the label sheets or print on plain paper and cut and paste. Check that you get the alignment correct so that the information on the tag is correct about each of the models with the ID number centered on the tag, Breed/sex info above, ID number in the middle, and age & model finish info below.

The show will be using the Tag Manager system to generate the results. Horses entered must be registered to generate results. The Tag Manager can also generate your horse list for the show.

Please turn in a list of entry horses entered either on or before the show day. The list should look similar to this:

Directions

From the South – Take Adirondack Northway (I-87N) north at Albany to Clifton Park. Exit at Northway Exit 9 onto Rte 146 West. The mall is located on the south side of the highway within 1/4 mile of the exit. See below for exact location. ***

From the North – Take Adirondack Northway (I-87S) south, past Saratoga Springs, to Clifton Park. Exit at Northway Exit 9 onto Rte 146 West. See below for exact location. ***

From the East – Take Rte 7 (or the Mass Pike) to Rte I-87N at Albany or Latham. Take Rte I-87 north at Albany to Clifton Park. Exit at Northway Exit 9 onto Rte 146 West. See below for exact location. ***

From the West – Take I-90 West. Exit at Albany onto I-87 North. Exit at Northway Exit 9 onto Rte 146 West. See below for exact location. *** (If you are adventurous, you can put the request into Mapquest and get off I-90 in Schenectady and cut off about 20 minutes off the trip on some back roads. You will pick up Rte 146 around Rexford and follow that into Clifton Park)

***The mall is located on the south side of the highway within 1/4 mile of the exit. You will turn left at the first available roadway at the traffic light. There is a Mobile Gas Station and a Bank of America at the corner. The mall will be on the left behind the Dunkin Donuts. The show venue will be inside the main mall entrance (sign says Boscovs). There will be signage directing to the exact storefront.

Hotels – Accommodations

There are five hotels in the immediate area of the mall. They are relatively new. I have never stayed at these hotels so I am not able to say how they are. **However,** August is the height of the summer season at Saratoga and accommodations are at a premium.
